



Board Approves Refund of \$2.27 million to Members PCA to be a Credit in 2022

I am pleased to share some great news with our members regarding electric rates in 2022. During this time of

higher-than-normal inflation, the Board has decided to not adjust our base rates for the 7th consecutive year, and we are actually providing lower electricity costs for our members with a credit power cost adjustment (PCA) in 2022.

Our power supplier, Northwest lowa Power Cooperative (NIPCO) passed along three bill credits to us in the last eight months. NIPCO was able to provide these bill credits to its membership because of serval factors including: 1) membership in Southwest Power Pool, 2) membership in Basin Electric Power Cooperative, and 3) prudent rate setting practices by

the NIPCO Board of Directors. We will provide more detail on this at our Annual Meeting, but I wanted to share the good news that your electric costs will be lower in 2022 than they were in 2021.

In September 2021, after one of the bill credits from NIPCO, we announced that the power cost adjustment (PCA) factor on our members electric bills would be reduced from 1.2 mills to 0 for the last four months of 2021 and all of 2022. This action will result in an approximate \$1.2 million refund to our members.

We received an additional \$2.27 million bill credit from NIPCO on our December power bill. The board has decided to refund this amount to our members as well. and we will be doing this through a credit PCA of 3.3 mills in 2022. With the reduction from 1.2 mills to 0 that went into effect in September 2021, along with this further reduction to a credit 3.3 mills, our members are receiving a total refund of nearly \$3.5 million through the reduced PCA factor, or approximately 5.5%. We believe this demonstrates the real cooperative difference our members enjoy by being a member of North West REC.

2022 Annual Meeting to be Hybrid Event Again This Year

We are looking forward to our Annual Meeting which is scheduled for Thursday evening, March 31 at 6:30 p.m. It will be held at the Skate Palace in Ida Grove. The meeting will also be live streamed for those members who aren't able to attend. Why in Ida Grove? For many years, we have been rotating the location of our Annual Meeting between our four districts. The schedule called for the Annual Meeting to be in District 4, Ida County, this year. Last year, our Annual Meeting was in District 1, Sioux County; and in 2020, it was in District 3, Plymouth County. We recognize that distance is an issue for many of our members when we rotate the meeting location, so we will once again be live streaming the meeting on our Facebook page and on our web site. We hope you will be able to either attend the meeting in person or participate on-line. We have some great prizes again this year and any member who either attends in person or on-line is eligible to win.

Will there be District Meetings this year? No, we are not planning to have March district meetings this year. The Board of Directors decided in 2020 to discontinue our March district meetings and to put more of our member engagement emphasis on our Member Appreciation Events in the Fall. We are able to hold those events outdoors at our County Fair locations, and we have seen increased participation from families and some of our younger members at these events. This has worked well the last two years and we plan to continue with that format again this year. In late August and early September, we will be hold a Member Appreciation Event in each district with a good meal and activities for the whole family. We will also be handing out patronage checks at those fall events.

Director election ballots and question cards: You should have recently received our annual meeting mailing that includes the ballot for director election in your district and a question card. We encourage your participation by voting on the director election, returning the question card, and either attending in person or joining online. We will be using the questions that are submitted by our members in our question and answer panel discussion during the Annual Meeting. Thank you for your cooperation and participation in this important annual meeting process.

Board of Directors Update

We wanted to inform our members of a recent director change. The Board of Directors accepted the resignation of Shirley Benson as a District 3 director at the December 23, 2021, board meeting. Shirley





served for 9-1/2 years and we thank her for her dedicated service. We wish Shirley and her husband Bob all the best in the years ahead.

At the January 27, 2022, board meeting, the Board of Directors took action to appoint Shirley Schroeder to fill the District 3 director position. Shirley and her husband Tony have been long-time North West REC members and farm between Le Mars and Remsen. We welcome Shirley to the NWREC Board of Directors.

Board Officer changes:

With the resignation of Shirley Benson, who was the Secretary of the Board, Steve Brown was elected to fill the Secretary officer position. Dale Ullrich was elected to fill the Assistant-Secretary Treasurer officer position.

The other officers of the Board of Directors are Jeff Rehder, President; Doug Becker, Vice President; Tom Wagner, Treasurer; Lyle Korver, Chief Executive Officer.

Directors Complete Training:

Two directors recently completed director training programs through NRECA. Dale Ullrich has completed the NRECA Board Leadership Program. Dan Hoffman has completed the Credentialed



Cooperative Director Program. Both of these programs help to prepare directors to fulfill their fiduciary duty as elected officials serving on behalf of the membership.

Managers Report Continued



The following is a brief summary of the discussions and decisions from the board meeting that was held on January 27, 2022:

- Appointed Shirley Schroeder to fill the open board seat in District 3 following the resignation of Shirley Benson in December.
- Manager Korver provided an update on 2021's operations. In spite of the ongoing COVID challenges we faced throughout the year, North West REC had a very successful year overall.
- Received monthly safety, operations and financial reports from staff. Derald Philips reported that we had another safe year of operations and that the employees have now worked six years since our last lost-time accident and there has only been one in the last ten years.
- Approved the work order summary for 2021.
 The total of all work orders completed for 2021 construction projects was \$4,795,973.
- Reviewed plans for the Annual Meeting which will be held on March 31 at the Skate Palace in Ida Grove. It will be livestreamed online and members will also have the option of attending.

- The Board approved refunding the year-end bill credit from NIPCO to our members through a credit power cost adjustment (PCA). The December bill credit was \$2.27 million and this will be refunded to our members through the 12 months of 2022 by reducing our PCA from 0 to a credit 3.3 mills per kWh.
- Manager Korver reported on several economic development projects that are underway.
- Heard reports from Director Wagner on the recent NIPCO and Basin Board Meetings.
- Director Rehder gave a CFC Board Report.
- Approved Operation Round-Up donations to several charitable organizations, our County 4-H groups, and medical emergency situations.
- Membership applications of new members were approved.
- Board Committee assignments for 2022 were approved.

- Install poles, overhead lines and other equipment.
- · Work on both energized and deenergized lines.
- · Install and service underground lines.

Peak demand determines, in part, the cost of electricity purchased by our wholesale power provider, NIPCO. As peak demand grows, power suppliers must provide more electric generation to keep up with the load demand.

Energy consumption is measured in kilowatt-hours (kWh). Power demand is measured in watts (W) or kilowatts (kW). A lightbulb "consumes" a certain number of watts: let's say 100 watts per hour. If that light bulb stays on for 10 hours, it "demands" a certain number of kilowatts (in this case, 1 kW) from the generation station producing electricity. Now, if you turn on 10, 100-watt lightbulbs in your home for one hour, you are still consuming the same number of kW. However, you are placing a greater demand on the co-op to have those kW available to you over the course of one hour, instead of ten. This requires the generation plant to produce more power in less time to meet the energy demands of all members at the same time. It also requires expanded infrastructure (similar to a 4-lane interstate expanding to 8 lanes to meet the demands of rush hour traffic).

Our co-op purchases kilowatt hours from our G&T (NIPCO) based on the demand for our members. Peak demand refers to the moment in time when the demand for electricity is the highest. If there isn't enough electric generation produced to keep up with peak demand, more generation facilities may need to be built which means a higher price per kilowatt and more cost to you, our member-owner. By helping to reduce peak demand, you can help keep power cost lower and conserve energy.




