2022 Scholarship Winners


North West REC provides several scholarships to high school students each spring. These scholarships are funded by North West REC and Basin Electric Power Cooperative, a consumer-owned, regional generation and transmission (G&T) cooperative based in Bismarck, N.D., responsible for supplying wholesale electric power to eight Midwestern states.

The scholarship program is designed to recognize and encourage the academic achievement of students in the region; it is also an investment in the economic future of rural areas. **This year North West REC awarded seventy-five scholarships totaling \$31,000.** There were eight \$1,000 scholarships, twenty-five \$500 scholarships, and forty-two \$250 scholarships. The \$1,000 scholarship winners were chosen from applications revived by our scholarship committee. The \$500 and \$250 scholarship winners were randomly drawn from the remainder of the applicants who also completed a educational questionnaire about North West REC.

First Half of the Year Update

I'm pleased to report that your Cooperative is having a good start to 2022. We have experienced a solid increase in kWh sales which is important for our ability to continue to keep electric rates stable. For the first six months of 2022, kWh sales are up 5% compared to the first six months of 2021.

In spite of continuing challenges with extended delivery times on much of our line materials, our Operations Department has been able to stay very busy with building in new services, completing service upgrades and working on line replacement projects. So far this year, we have added 22 new services and completed 83 service upgrades. In addition, our crews have built 9 miles of overhead line and replaced 19.5 miles of older

overhead line with new underground cable.

The spring storms have caused some damage to our system, and this has resulted in an increased number of outages for our members compared to recent years. As I am writing this article in early July, we have received some much needed rain in this past week but as typically happens this time of year, when we get thunder and wind storms, our outages increase. Year-to-date our average outage minutes

per member are 63 minutes and that is up from last year when we were at only 19 minutes and the year before at 39 minutes. Thank you for your patience and understanding during these times when storms present some challenges for us.

Similar to what many other businesses have been

experiencing, we have had a higher turnover rate in terms of our employees. Most of this has been on the line crew as we have had several linemen, who are not originally from northwest lowa, relocate to positions closer to their hometowns. We have been fortunate to find some good young apprentice lineman to replace them, and we are pleased with how they are working well with our experienced crew members and also working safely.

Financially your Cooperative is having an excellent year. Total margins are \$699,686 and this is \$499,773 higher than budgeted margins. This is primarily due to the increase in kWh sales, lower purchased power costs than budgeted, and more of our labor being capitalized than we had budgeted. We are hoping the rest of the year goes as well as the first half has gone. Further updates will be provided as the year progresses





The following is a brief summary of the discussion and decisions from the board meeting that was held on June 30, 2022:

- The monthly safety report was presented and approved.
- Manager Korver presented his monthly report, including updates on service reliability and updates on recent storm damage, operations, kWh sales, 2022 Youth Tour to Washington, D.C.
- The Board approved a recommendation to request NIPCO to build a new substation in the Rock Ridge business park area of Rock Valley, due to recent and planned business expansions.
- Curt Ahrenholz presented the monthly financial reports.
- Final plans for the Member Appreciation Day events were reviewed and approved, including adding an EV & Classic Car Event this year.

- Membership applications of new members were approved.
- The Board President of the Iowa Association of Electric Cooperatives, Roger Solomonson, shared an update on our Statewide's activities.
- The Board approved a new three phase "all energy" rate.
- Manager Korver reported on some economic development projects that are underway.
- Heard reports from Director Wagner on the recent NIPCO & Basin Board Meetings.
- Director Rehder gave a CFC Board Report.
- Approved Operation Round-Up donations.




How does the Switch Makes Cents program save you money?

When you choose to participate in the Switch Makes Cents (SMC) load management program, you will have the benefit of avoiding peak demand costs as well as being able to receive the all-electric interruptible heat rate of just \$0.049 per KWH. This is

for all KWH's sold for electric heating, cooling, and water heating usage that are connected to the switch!

The SMC program also helps stabilize future power costs to your cooperative by reducing peak demand which determines, in part, the cost of electricity purchased by our wholesale power provider NIPCO. Reducing peak demand reduces the amount of electricity the electrical generation facilities need to produce, thus keeping them from having to build more facilities which would result in a higher price per kilowatt and more cost to you.


