North West REC provides several scholarships to high school students each spring. These scholarships are funded by North West REC and Basin Electric Power Cooperative, a consumer-owned, regional generation and transmission (G&T) cooperative based in Bismarck, N.D., responsible for supplying wholesale electric power to eight Midwestern states.

The scholarship program is designed to recognize and encourage the academic achievement of students in the region; it is also an investment in the economic future of rural areas. This year North West REC awarded four \$1,000 scholarships, one scholarship to a student from each of the four districts we serve. The \$1,000 scholarship recipients were Emma Zwart (District 1), Jason Konz (District 2), Katelyn Langel (District 3), and Kara Richard (District 4).

Board Room Summary - May/June

The following is a brief summary of the discussion and decisions from the May and June board meetings:

- Received monthly safety, operations and financial reports from staff.
- Discussed plans for new member appreciation events scheduled for August 27 and September. 5.
- Heard an update on our FEMA application relating to storm damages from the March flooding and April ice storm events.
- Received a report about the new electric vehicle (Chevrolet Bolt).
- Approved an interconnection agreement for a 12 kW solar system that one of our members is installing.
- Received an update on the load management pilot project.
- Heard a report on the planning trip for the NRECA International Project in Guatemala. Mike Berkenpas, NWREC lineman from Le Mars, is participating in this project.
- Received a staffing update. A new lineman was recently hired to fill a vacant position on the Ida Grove line crew. Tyler Lindhoff, recent graduate from the NCC Powerline program, was hired.
- The Board authorized management to draw down additional CFC loan funds to take advantage of low interest rates and to finance some upcoming line replacement projects.
- Reviewed a depreciation analysis. The Board decided to keep the current depreciation rates as they are.
- Heard reports from Director Tom Wagner on the recent NIPCO and Basin Board Meetings.
- Received a technology & cyber security update from James Vondrak, IT Administrator.
- Approved recommendations from the Operations Round Up Committee.
- Approved membership applications for new members.
- Appointed delegates and alternates for future meetings of associated organizations.

This exercise refreshes their memory of the steps to safely climb a pole when the need arises.





IOWA'S ELECTRIC COOPERATIVES SENT 38 STUDENTS TO D.C. FOR A

Week of Leadership Development

Thirty-eight high school students representing Iowa's locally owned electric cooperatives traveled to Washington, D.C., from June 14-20 and joined more than 1,900 other students from across the nation for the 2019 Electric Cooperative Youth Tour. Iowa's electric cooperatives were the first ones to send students to Washington, D.C., back in 1958; this year marks the 61st anniversary of the journey.

"The Youth Tour is the highlight of the summer for many students, and we're proud to send 38 of lowa's best and brightest to our nation's capital this year to participate," said Chuck Soderberg, Executive Vice President of the Iowa Association of Electric Cooperatives. "These students gained a first-hand understanding of the legislative process and made connections with other student leaders from across the



country that will last a lifetime. We look forward to continuing the Youth Tour tradition for years to come."

Sponsored by North West REC, Paige Dagel of Sanborn and Valeria Uribe of Le Mars participated in leadership training, engaged in one-on-one conversations with elected officials, jumpstarted their national peer network, learned about electric cooperatives, and toured the monuments and museums of Washington, D.C.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY LOANS FOR HOMEOWNERS

An energyefficiency loan from North West REC can be an effective way to improve

your home and save energy. The loan may be made for qualifying energy efficient home improvements such as new electric heating systems, an electric water heater, or energy efficient windows and doors.

If interested in an energy efficiency loan, members must complete a loan application and provide a complete itemized bill. This bill may include electric heat equipment, wiring, labor, electric water heater, and electric space conditioning equipment for cooling. Insulation expense, to improve the integrity of the building and the space to be conditioned, may be included in a loan. The loan application and credit check will be reviewed by the board of directors.

Other specifics of our loan program for North West REC members include:

- Minimum amount of \$500 to \$999 written for one year.
- Maximum amount of \$7,000 for equipment upgrade, written for three years.
- Maximum amount of \$4,000 for house improvement of insulation, doors, windows, caulking, weatherstripping, etc.
- 5.50% simple interest
- Monthly payments included on electric bill
- No penalty for early pay-off

North West REC will deduct any rebates from the total itemized bill and will finance up to 90% of the remainder upon approval from our board of directors.

OPERATION ROund Up REPORT

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Disbursements made from North West REC's Operation Round Up Trust in the second quarter of 2019 totaled \$9,900. This brings the total disbursements made from Operation Round Up since its inception in June of 1999 to \$459,455. Many people have been helped thanks to our members.

- \$6,100..... Medical Emergencies assist families with unusual expenses resulting from serious health problems and accident related injuries
- \$2,000..... Mid-Sioux Opportunity, Upper Des Moines Opportunity and Justice for All program support
- \$1,000 Primghar Community Building, Boyden Public Library, Sanborn American Legion and Ida Grove Heritage Days – community development projects
- \$ 800...... Inspiration Hills, Camp Invention and Floyd Valley Hospital Foundation support for children's fund and children's camps/programs

Operation Round Up funds are generated through a voluntary rounding up of cooperative members' electric bills to the next nearest dollar, and dollars are used to assist worthy causes and organizations right in your local county area.


